

The Hamlet Council at the regular meeting held on June 14, 2018 unanimously passed the following resolution:

**Whereas:** Agnico Eagle Mines (AEM) has expressed a strong interest in doing further exploration in the Whale Cove Huckleberry Exploration Project area (NIRB # 17EA068) and (3) three new areas lying within 70 Km of Whale Cove; and

**Whereas:** Northquest (since 2016 owned 100% by Nordgold SE) have been exploring in the Whale Cove area since 2011, both on Inuit owned land and Crown land, and wish to continue exploration; and

**Whereas:** the Hamlet Council and HTO of Whale Cove fully support the AEM 'Huckleberry Exploration Project', and the Nordgold' Pistol Bay Project,' with conditions similar to those proven effective in the protection of wildlife and the environment, in other exploration areas in the Kivalliq Region; and

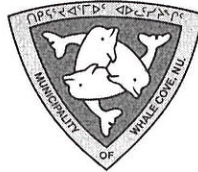
**Whereas:** the Kivalliq Inuit Association (KIA) is now imposing very restrictive' mobile caribou measures' more restrictive than those agreed to at the Whale Tail NIRB hearings and the Meliadine IIBA, which basically prevent meaningful exploration during the summer months; and

**Whereas:** the Hamlet of Whale Cove is concerned that these restrictive mobile measures will discourage further exploration activity in our area, and therefore have a serious effect on the economic and employment opportunities available to our residents who are mainly Inuit; and

**Whereas:** the current mineral resources in Baker Lake and Rankin Inlet will eventually be depleted, leading to unemployment of hundreds of Inuit mine workers unless exploration companies are given some inspiration to continue with their planned exploration activities.

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## Now Therefore be it resolved that:

The Hamlet Council of Whale Cove at the earliest opportunity convene a meeting in Whale Cove of all interested parties, in order to achieve a meaningful agreement, with doable and reasonable measures to allow exploration activity to continue on both IOL and Crown Land during the summer months, while ensuring the protection of wildlife in our area.
