PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Ulu Gold Project” is located within the Kitikmeot region, approximately 200 kilometres (km) from Kugluktuk. The Proponent intends to conduct exploration and continue remediation of the site. The program is proposed to take place from May 2020 to May 2025. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- establishment of a new temporary exploration camp and associated water supply;
- increase water withdrawal amount in current licence to 200m³/day;
- collect a 5,000 tonne bulk sample for offsite processing; and
- undertake environmental baseline studies including but not limited to archeology, fish, water and wildlife to support an environmental assessment.

- a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and can be prevented/managed appropriately with known technology.

Parties are also invited to recommend any specific mitigation measures they feel would be appropriate, and to bring any other matter of importance related to this project proposal to the NIRB’s attention.
