<b>CONCERNS</b>	
<p>The Project Description lacks information about wildlife harvesting and reporting in the event of a wildlife mortality. It should be made clear that wildlife harvesting while on patrol is not permitted and if any mortalities do occur, whether intentional or accidental, they must be immediately reported to the local Department of Environment Conservation Officer. Location, identity and quantity of species, as well as cause of death should be noted and reported.</p> <p>On the patrol between Grise Fiord and Eureka, special care should be taken to avoid disturbance to wildlife, in particular Peary caribou and muskoxen.</p>	
<b>SUGGESTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS</b>	
<p>Report any and all wildlife mortalities to the local Department of Environment Conservation Officer or Department of Environment Headquarters.</p>

Mention of public notice of live-fire exercises and use of explosives was not found in the Project documents. This is a concern, since harvesters may inadvertently encounter these activities while in operation.	
<b>SUGGESTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS</b>	
The communities of Resolute Bay and Rankin Inlet should be made publicly aware of when and where and live-fire exercises, such as ranges or ice breaching with explosives, will occur so any harvesters that are heading out will know to avoid the areas.
