PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Hard Cash” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 405 kilometres (km) from Arviat. The Proponent intends to conduct a mineral exploration program including drilling, sampling, magnetic surveying, and mapping. The program is proposed to take place from May 2020 to September 2025. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Reverse circulation drilling program to conduct on-land drilling, consisting of ten (10) 150 meter holes
- Ground magnetic survey
- Collection of soil and rock samples
- Geological mapping
