## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Coastal Surveys of Common Eider Nesting Islands in the Belcher Island Archipelago, Nunavut” project is located within the Qikiqtani (South Baffin) region, approximately 125 kilometres (km) from Sanikiluaq. The Proponent intends to conduct population surveys for common eiders in Belcher Island Archipelago, including the Sleeper Islands in order to determine potential ecological changes in colony distributions and sizes. The program is proposed to take place from June to September 2020. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Conduct surveys of common eider nests on nesting islands around Sanikiluaq
- Collect information on potential nest predators
- Opportunistic collection of polar bear feces and any carcasses or parts of birds found for disease analysis
- Use of boats to access study locations
