Hi Raquel,

Sorry for the late correspondence. Staff with the NIRB have reviewed your online application and we have a few questions we were hoping you can answer before proceeding with the screening of your project proposal:

1. What type of project authorizations have you applied for the installation of the incinerator? The "Project Authorizations" tab is incomplete We started our application with Nunavut Water Board who referred us to the Nunavut Planning Commission, who then transferred us to the NIRB. We were hoping you would be able to confirm which authorizations are necessary and what information we are missing in order to move forward with this project.
 - a. Are you looking at amending your Type B Water Licence (1BR-THI2027) to include the incinerator? Will this be a Type A water licence? An amendment will be made and from what I understood, it will remain a type B licence.
 - b. Have you discussed the installation of the incinerator and the proximity to the Territorial Park with the Government of Nunavut, Department of Environment? Our procedure includes work hours based on the wind direction. The figure attached shows the distances from the site to the river and the bay.
 - i. Will you require a permit from GN-DoE for this installation? After reaching out to them, the GN-DoE does not have any regulations concerning the incineration of solid wastes.
 - ii. Will you be updating your Hazardous Waste Management Registration with the GN? No unless it is deemed necessary.
 - c. Are you amending the "Development Permit" with the City of Iqaluit? No this will not be necessary as the unit is a mobile portable incinerator. The city will be advised that there will be a mobile incinerator on-site
 - d. Any other authorizations/permits, etc? No, not that we know of for now.
1. What types of consultation have you conducted? There is no information provided under the "Community Involvement and Regional Benefits" tab. We have been in communication with the Department of Environment, Department of Health, NWB, NPC
 1. Discussions with the City of Iqaluit? Not yet.
 2. Have you discussed the installation of the incinerator with Environment and Climate Change Canada? Have they provided any guidance? No
1. What types of wastes will be generated from the proposed project? There is no information

provided under the “Type of Waste Associated with the Proposed Project Activities” tab. [Ash waste](#)

1. Indicate what will occur with the ash from the incinerator in this tab The ash will be treated case by case. It will be analyzed for leachate metals and toxic products and depending on the results, it will either be sent South for disposal or we will ask the city for disposal at the landfill.
 2. How will you store the wastes prior to incinerations? Waste for incineration will be stored on a liner taped inside a closed box which are approved for biomedical waste. These boxes are locked in 20 foot containers and kept in a fenced area with no public access.
1. Do you have a spill contingency plan in place for the fuel tank that will be installed inside the container? Our current spill contingency spill will be updated to include this activities when the amendment is made.
