PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Quarry Pit” project is located within the Kitikmeot region, within the Hamlet boundaries of Cambridge Bay. The Proponent intends to extract sand and gravel from an existing unauthorized quarry site to meet the construction demands of the community of Cambridge Bay. The program is proposed to take place from August 2020 to October 2021. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Operation of a quarry site to access sand and gravel material for community construction needs with an estimated maximum extraction volume of 1,000 cubic meters (m³);
- Use of existing municipal road to access the quarry site;
- Use of equipment including a skid steer and truck/trailer to dig and transport gravel and sand; and
- Disposal of waste in the Cambridge Bay landfill as appropriate;
