Sorry to bug you again. Dunnednin and Solstice have now agreed that Solstice should have a separate fuel cache adjacent to the Kahuna Camp fuel cache, to be permitted under the Solstice LUP and water licence. The cache would be for 300 drums of aviation fuel, diesel and gasoline. Our NWB Technical Advisor has requested that we confirm with NPC that this does not change the Project Scope and therefore still does not require NPC conformity determination or NIRB screening. Are you able to confirm this?

Solstice is actually a spin out company of Dunedin Ventures Inc. and they are pretty much doing the exact same work that was previously reviewed and approved for Dunedin's Kahuna Diamond Project permits/licences (NPC file numbers 148166, 148367 and 148649; NIRB file number 15EN028; CIRNAC Land Use Permit N2015C0019, NWB water licence 2BE-KDP1722 and Kivalliq Inuit Association Land Use Licences KVL315B01 and KVRW16F01). The only real difference is the Solstice is exploring for Gold and Dunedin is exploring for Diamonds.

How do you think we should proceed? I.e. Did you want me to state all this in the NPC application messages?
