# PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed "1990s Caribou Camp and Fuel Cache Clean-Up (Ahiak Migratory Bird Sanctuary)" project is located within the Kitikmeot region, approximately 200 kilometres (km) from Cambridge Bay. The Proponent intends to conduct a Site Cleanup/Remediation within the Ahiak Migratory Bird Sanctuary. The program is proposed to take place from August 2021 to August 2023. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of Twin Otter to remove waste from an abandoned caribou hunting camp to Cambridge Bay for disposal,
- Use of helicopter for transport between the camp site and Cambridge Bay;
- Use of a generator for electricity
- The fuel and the drums from the remediation will be taken to Cambridge Bay for disposal by a local company
