## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Precious Metal Property” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 50 kilometres (km) from Baker Lake. The Proponent intends to conduct the scope of previously approved activities to drill 15,000 to 20,000 metres with up to four (4) drills, construct a new campsite, and the increase of fuel storage. The program is proposed to take place from March to June 2021. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Establishment of a temporary twenty (20) person exploration camp;
- Transportation, temporary storage (cache), and use of up to 46,125 Litres of gasoline and diesel fuel;
- Use of two (2) helicopters to transport personnel, equipment, and supplies to various sites and conduct surveys on the property; and
- Use of four (4) diamond drill for core sample collection.
