PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Turquetil-Esker Drilling” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 187 kilometres (km) from Arviat. The Proponent intends to conduct Helicopter-supported mineral exploration drilling and ground geophysical surveying. The program is proposed to take place from July 2021 to July 2023. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of the Henik Lake Camp as a base of operations;
- Use of up to 2 helicopters for daily transport of personnel and supplies between Henik Lake Camp and exploration sites;
- Use of aircraft for weekly resupply flights to Arviat; and
- Supplies and equipment transported from Churchill and Thompson, Manitoba via aircraft.
