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<p>Do you have any suggestions or recommendations for this application?</p> <p>Fisheries and Oceans Canada recommends the proponent review the Interim Code of Practice for End-of-pipe fish screens (https://www.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/pnw-ppe/codes/screen-ecran-eng.html) and the Measures to Protect Fish and Fish Habitat (http://www.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/pnw-ppe/measures-mesures-eng.html). If the project is able to comply with the conditions and measures set out in the Interim Code of Practice, the Fish and Fish Habitat Protection Program (the Program) is of the view that your proposal will not require an authorization under the Fisheries Act or the Species at Risk Act; however, we recommend that a Notification Form be submitted. Should your plans change, if you have omitted some information in your proposal, or if the project is unable to comply with the Interim Codes of Practice or the Measures to Protect Fish and Fish Habitat, we recommend that the proponent submit a Request for Review (http://www.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/pnw-ppe/reviews-revues/forms-formes/request-demand-eng.pdf) of the project. It remains the responsibility of the proponent to remain in compliance with the <i>Fisheries Act</i>, avoid prohibited effects on listed aquatic species at risk, any part of their critical habitat or the residences of their individuals, and prevent the introduction of non-indigenous species.</p>
