RE: NPC File # 149571[Gjoa Haven New Power Plant]

The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. Construction of a new power plant in Gjoa Haven consisting of two (2) new 90,000 L horizontal fuel tanks with secondary containment, appropriate pumping facilities, Quonset garage, transformer storage, pole racks, oil and glycol drum storage and waste disposal area (with secondary containment berm), space for a transient staff accommodation unit, sea cans for storage, and a back-up emergency generator.
2. An approximately 50-metre fuel pipeline will be constructed to connect to the Petroleum Products Division (PPD) bulk fuel storage facility located to the east. The pipeline will be a combination of aboveground and underground construction. The new plant will be capable of integrating renewable energy sources.

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3. Upgrades to the existing distribution system will also be required to connect to the new power plant.
4. Location: Kitikmeot Region; [Gjoa Haven].

The Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) has determined that this project proposal is outside the area of an applicable regional land use plan.
