The Fish and Fish Habitat Protection Program encourage all project proponents to avoid causing the death of fish and the harmful alteration, disruption or destruction of fish habitat. Based on the information provided, the proposal has been identified as a project that will not require an authorization under the <i>Fisheries Act</i> or the <i>Species at Risk Act</i> . It remains the responsibility of the proponent to remain in compliance with the <i>Fisheries Act</i> , avoid prohibited effects on listed aquatic species at risk, any part of their critical habitat or the residences of their individuals, and prevent the introduction of non-indigenous species.
