## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Igloolik New Power Plant” project is located in the Qikiqtani region, within the municipal boundaries of Igloolik. The Proponent intends to construct and operate a new power plant which will include a four-engine generation facility, consisting of two (2) new 90,000 litre double-walled, 110% contained horizontal fuel tanks, appropriate pumping facilities, Quonset garage, Transformer storage, pole racks, oil and glycol drum storage and waste disposal area. An approximately 250-meter fuel pipeline will be constructed to connect to the Petroleum Products Division (PPD) bulk storage facility. The program is proposed to take place from April 4, 2024 to March 31, 2026. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of a Grader for civil construction to level soil/gravel
- Use of a Compactor machine to compact the site grounds
- Use of a tower crane to lift construction materials to height
- Use of a Bored pile drilling machine to pile construction
