

Project background and introduction

Know History has been hired by Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. (NTI) to conduct cultural resources inventories of seven Migratory Bird Sanctuaries (MBSs) and National Wildlife Areas (NWAs) in Nunavut, including Ikkattuaq (Harry Gibbons) and Qaqsauqtuuq (East Bay) MBSs. The goal of this project is to collect information about cultural resources and areas of importance to Inuit within these MBSs. The inventories will be made available through a digital platform housed in each of the associated communities. All data collected and developed during this project will be owned by NTI and be catalogued in a secure, password-protected database.

Members of the Coral Harbour community have been invited to participate in this project by sharing their knowledge. All participants will be asked to consent to the use of their information in reports and publications related to this project and in the cultural resource inventories. Participants will be asked to consent to video and/or audio recording or photographs.

Interviews with community members will be held between 17 May and 11 June, 2021.
