The Northern Participant Funding Program (the Program) has provided additional participant funding for the Nunavut Impact Review Board's (the Board) reconsideration of Baffinland Iron Mines Corporation's proposed Mary River Phase 2 Project to seven recipients, in order to support participation in the November 2021 hearings.

Over the course of the Board's reconsideration process, the Program has reviewed and approved funding allocations to 14 applicants through an unprecedented six rounds of funding. I am satisfied that these allocations will provide the best value to the Mary River Phase 2 Project Certificate reconsideration and am thus pleased to announce the following amounts to the successful applicants:
