PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Cultural Resource Inventory” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 75 kilometres (km) from Coral Harbour. The Proponent intends to collect information about cultural resources and areas of importance to Inuit within the study areas. The program is proposed to take place from August to September 2022. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of an aircraft, boat, and ATVs for transportation to and from Coral Harbour to the Migratory Bird Sanctuaries (MBS);
- Video interviews with elders and knowledge holders within the MBS; and
- Set up and use of temporary camp while in MBS varying from 1 to 4 days
 - Proper disposal of all waste.

Parties are also invited to recommend any specific mitigation measures they feel would be appropriate, and to bring any other matter of importance related to this project proposal to the NIRB’s attention.
