Your proposal has been reviewed to determine whether it is likely to result in the death of fish by means other than fishing and the harmful alteration, disruption or destruction of fish habitat which are prohibited under subsections 34.4(1) and 35(1) of the <i>Fisheries Act</i> ; and, effects to listed aquatic species at risk, any part of their critical habitat or the residences of their individuals in a manner which is prohibited under sections 32, 33 and subsection 58(1) of the <i>Species at Risk Act</i> . The <i>Fisheries Act</i> protects all marine mammals under the provisions of the <i>Marine Mammal Regulations</i> of the <i>Act</i> , which prohibits the disturbance of a marine mammal.
