**CIRNAC #1: Consultation with Interested Parties**


CIRNAC recommends that the Proponent individually consult with the hamlets and hunters and trappers organizations in each community that they expect to visit. These may include: the Hamlet of Pond Inlet, the Hamlet Council of Clyde River, the Hamlet of Qikiqtarjuaq, the Hamlet of Pangnirtung, the City of Iqaluit, the Mittimatalik Hunters and Trappers Organization, the Clyde River Hunters and Trappers Organization, the Qikiqtarjuaq Hunters and Trappers Association, the Pangnirtung Hunters and Trappers Organization, and the Amaruq Hunters and Trappers Organization. Issues that should be considered as part of any consultation activities should include:

- Incorporation of Inuit knowledge and Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit into project activities;
- Mitigation measures designed to prevent any disturbance to wildlife and the environment;
- The experience of community members who participate in traditional and non-traditional activities within or in close proximity to the project area;
- Regular updates on the status of project activities.



CIRNAC appreciates the opportunity to provide comments and looks forward to working with the NIRB and the Proponent throughout any further phases related to this project.
