After a quick search in our data base and the Government of Nunavut (GN) data system I have found that the lot (447) you are talking about is in fact within the Hamlet of Baker Lake and appears to be under the administration and control of the GN.

Our office only authorizes land use in areas under the administration and control of Crown Land. I believe you may want to seek authorization from the Hamlet or the Commissioner.
