PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Nunavut Feasibility Study” project is located in the Kivalliq and Qikiqtani regions, within the Municipal boundaries of Coral Harbour, Chesterfield Inlet, Nauyasat, and Sanikiluaq. The Proponent intends to conduct an engineering feasibility study for the construction of Small Craft Harbours (SCH) in four (4) communities in Nunavut: Sanikiluaq, Coral Harbour, Nauyasat and Chesterfield Inlet. The goal is to inform the engineering and environmental deliverables for the Project. A field program will be required which is planned for the open-water season of 2022 focusing on environmental, geoscience, geophysics and archaeological baseline studies in each location. A future drilling program will be undertaken in each of the communities at the detailed design phase of the Project. The program is proposed to take place from July 2022 to August 2023. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Scientific Collection (Marine) Transect line, iPad, clinometer, ROV, depth sounder, fishing equipment, plankton net, CTD, Niskin sampler, Petite ponar, drogue
- Scientific Collection (Terrestrial) GPS, iPad, binoculars, kestrel pocket weather meter, camera, quadrat, measuring tape, pins, flags, plant press, hand lens
- Use of a charter (plane) to fly the crew in and out of each of the communities
- Scientific Collection (Geotechnical/topographic) Geotechnical hammer, tape measure, hand lens, seismograph, hydrophones, submersible hydro cable, drone, GPS control stations
