Transport Canada (TC) previously reviewed this project under the Environmental Impact Screening Committee's environmental screening regime for projects in the Inuvialuit Settlement Region (File No 03/22-19). TC's comments were as follows:

**Marine Safety and Security**

Marine Safety and Security reviewed the Project Description and noted the following about Section 7.5, Proposed Activities at Project Location:

- There is no mention of briefing passenger on marine emergency duties and hazards prior to embarking the Zodiacs or any other time; and
- There is no mention of the Polar Waters Operational Manual and not submitted for review.

## Indigenous Relations Unit

Transport Canada recommends operators contact Territorial Land Claim Administrators to ensure the proper procedures are followed prior to arrival. Most Canadian Arctic communities welcome visitors, provided they are contacted well-in-advance and have a chance to prepare for visitors.

Community members enjoy the opportunity to share their hospitality, culture and knowledge of the Arctic. Many Arctic communities still practice traditional activities such as hunting, fishing and eating country foods. It is therefore important that visitors be respectful and culturally sensitive of these activities.
