Re: Support for the 6M tonnes 2022

Hi Mr. Penny, the Igloolik HTA held an open house radio show in the community of Igloolik to hear from the community regarding Baffinland's request to allow an extension to ship 6M tonnes in 2022. The Igloolik HTA heard from all its members in Igloolik, and there is some concern and hesitation but also optimism and support for the project. After listening, the community would like to support the project, but there is some concern in regards to wildlife and Inuit way of life and how this project can have an impact. With some consideration and deliberations by the HTA, it has been decided to issue support for Baffinland's request pending the following conditions.

1st. As BIM is aware, one of the most significant issues for neighbours communities is the dust generated at the mine site, transportation corridor and the stockpiles near the port.

BIM had committed to a dust audit and followed the suggestions if phase 2 was approved. Therefore, we request that BIM follows these suggestions ASAP as a condition for a 6M tonnes extension. If the communities see the dust issue has not been resolved at any time, that Baffinland halt project production and deal with dust from the project.

2nd. BIM has said that it will be laying off employees. We request no community employee be laid off. If 6M tons is approved.

3rd. We request that BIM do a baseline study in partnership with Igloolik/Hall Beach HTA's for marine, terrestrial and avian wildlife before construction begins for Phase 1.

4th. We request that BIM engage with Igloolik HTA to develop community infrastructure commitments; The Igloolik HTA would like to see Benefits to businesses, Women, youth and Hunters in Igloolik, Along with significant infrastructures like paving of roads, youth and women centers.

Mr. Penney, these are the conditions the Igloolik HTA has requested from BIM to support the 6M extension for 2022. As previously stated, we are not against mining but must ensure that our community's voices and rights are heard and acknowledged.
