RE: KAE June Community Visit and Open House in Coral Harbour

Dear Mayor Nakoolak,

We are reaching out today to communicate our gratitude and thanks for the community's hospitality and warmth during our recent visit to Coral Harbour. Our team greatly appreciated the opportunity to meet with Coral Harbour residents at our open house, to present the results of the Community Energy Plan, to share plans for the Solar Project, and to receive feedback and help answer questions.

We understand that many Council members, including yourself, were away at the time of our visit, which prevented us from meeting with Council directly. Nonetheless, we'd like to acknowledge everyone that was able to take time out of their spring activities to come to the open house. Residents of all ages brought great engagement and curiosity, gave helpful feedback, and showed interest in learning more. One of the highlights was the number of young people that attended, eager to learn about clean energy technology. We are certain that many children are walking away from this event with a whole new world of clean energy on their minds and new possibilities for the future. Our team was greatly encouraged by this turn out and response we received.

Additionally, we wanted to reiterate that our team would welcome the opportunity to provide more information and answer any questions that yourself or Council may have about the proposed Solar Project we are working to develop near the Coral Harbour airport. We are available to have a virtual meeting to facilitate such a conversation, if there is a desire to do so. Our goal is to ensure that the Solar Project is in alignment with the Hamlet's long term community planning, and to ensure that we keep communication open on the site location and upcoming work, as well as on opportunities for local involvement in construction and operation.

To keep communication open and moving forward, we have included below an update on our next steps for the project:

- Following our site visit, we have adjusted the site 300m to the southwest to move it away from several water bodies and onto a drier section of ground. This new site is still within the general area that was suggested to us by Council last summer.

- As a result of this small adjustment to the site location, we will be re-engaging with the Nunavut Planning Commission and NIRB, as well as with Transport Canada and NAV CANADA to verify that our proposed move is still acceptable from a safety, land use, and environmental perspective
- The team is continuing to investigate the state of electrical infrastructure servicing the airport, which will play a key role in the project's interconnection to the local grid. Some uncertainties remain here which need to be resolved to confirm the feasibility of building the project here.
- A survey crew was onsite during the week of July 4, to collect topographical data to inform further design and engineering
