The Proponent intends to conduct remediation of the abandoned Coral Harbour Site military facility. The program is proposed to take place from October 2022 to 2025. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Remediation of Coral Harbour Site
- Use of Heavy Equipment for remediation activities
- Improvement of site access routes, internal roads, and airstrips
- Construction of a temporary camp
