Please accept this letter as a request by Orano Canada Inc. (Orano) for a two-year extension to the current Kiggavik Project Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada (CIRNAC) Land Use Permit N2018C0010 which currently expires on January 24, 2023. Please find attached to this letter the Project Summary and project maps.

The exploration activities for the next two years will remain the same as those conducted from 2018 to 2022 as the project is in a care and maintenance phase. Activities may include inspection, camp maintenance, core storage maintenance and assessment of regeneration of previous drill locations. Activities will continue in accordance with the existing Management Plans (Plans), which have been provided as appendices to the Kiggavik Project's Annual Report. Revisions to the Plans will be submitted prior to field activities.

PROJECT SUMMARY

The Kiggavik Project is a uranium surface exploration project located approximately 80 kilometres west of the community of Baker Lake. The project consists of the Kiggavik lease, which contains the Kiggavik Site to the north and Sissons site to the south, and the St. Tropez lease north of the Kiggavik Site. The current Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs (CIRNAC) Land Use Permit will expire on January 24, 2023.

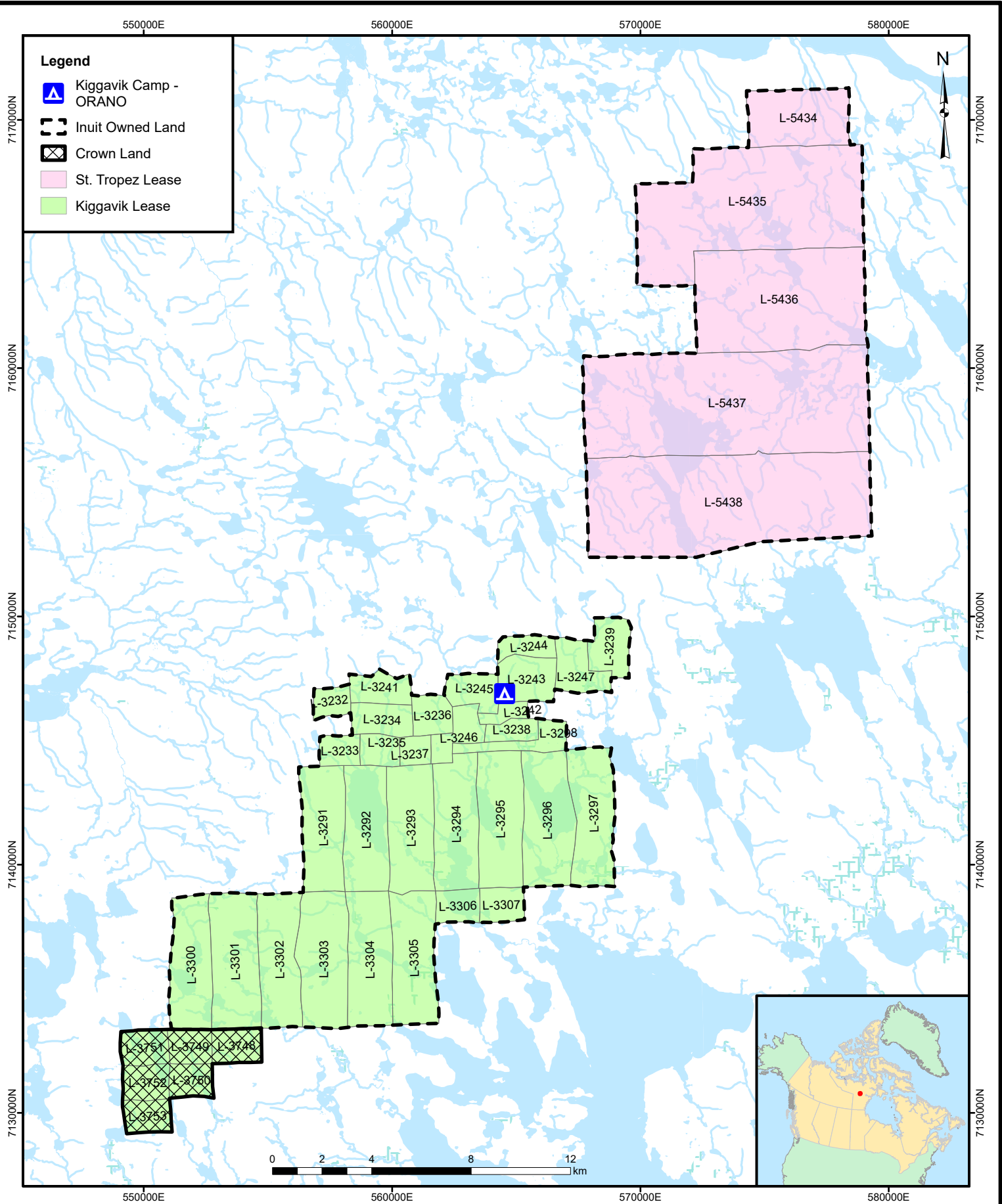
Planned activities over the next five years are similar compared to those conducted during the 2018 to 2022 field seasons. The Kiggavik Project is in a care and maintenance phase and no active fieldwork is planned for the term of this license. The potential activity on the CIRNAC leases for the term of this license is assessment of reclaimed sites.

During care and maintenance phase the site inspection will occur every five years, at a minimum.
