The proposed “South Kitikmeot Gold Project” is located within the Kitikmeot region, approximately 424 kilometres (km) from Kugluktuk. The Proponent intends to conduct mineral exploration of several mineral properties in the region. The program is proposed to take place from 2023 to 2029. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of small aircraft for mobilization;
- Use of helicopters for transportation of personnel and personnel to exploration sites;
- Use of drill rigs
- Establishment of a tent camp for up to 60 persons
