## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Black Feather Request for Commercial Guiding Permit in Bylot Island Migratory Bird Sanctuary” project is located within the Qikiqtani region, approximately 30 kilometres (km) from Pond Inlet. The Proponent intends to conduct adventure tourism trips based out of Pond Inlet and would like a permit to access the Bylot Island Migratory Bird Sanctuary. The program is proposed to take place from April 2023 to August 2025. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Setup and removal of a temporary base camp on ice/snow for the Ski and Floe Edge trips, and on sand/gravel for the Hiking trips.
- Hiring of local personnel as guides, bear monitors and other personnel as needed
- Use of snowmobiles and qamutiks to transport personnel and equipment to facilitate tourist activities.
- Removal of wastes (sewage and garbage) for proper disposal.
