Re: Geological Survey of Canada – Proposed Summer 2023 Geological Fieldwork

Dear Mr. Manzo,

The Geological Survey of Canada (GSC), through the GEM-GeoNorth Program, is proposing geoscience research activities in the Kivalliq region for the spring and summer of 2023. This letter, and the attached documents, are to provide information on these proposals and to seek your input and advice.

The research activities GEM-GeoNorth supports, like the ones we are proposing here, provide the data and regional geological knowledge that could support land-use decision making related to climate-resistant northern infrastructure, and exploration and development of mineral resources. All results, publications, maps, and data produced by GEM-GeoNorth research are made available publicly, for free, and will be shared upon release.

The activities proposed in the attached documents are related to field research that could take place in the summer months of 2023. Applications for permits and licenses related to these activities will be submitted to the Nunavut Planning Commission, the Nunavut Impact Review Board, the Nunavut Research Institute, and the Kivalliq Inuit Association. Additionally, we will also be reaching out in the coming weeks regarding proposed research activities that do not require any field work. Such activities may analyse previously collected samples and remotely sensed data.

The GEM-GeoNorth engagement team will be reaching out by phone in the coming days and will make themselves available at your convenience to answer questions or discuss these proposals in more detail. If you are interested, we can plan a visit and meetings regarding proposals for work on the land.
