Dear Hunters and Trappers Organization/Association,

We are requesting support to conduct an aerial survey of cetaceans (narwhal, beluga and bowhead whales) in August 2023. The proposed work would involve flying twin otters from the communities of Pangnirtung, Qikiqtarjuaq, Clyde River, Arctic Bay, Pond Inlet, Resolute Bay, Taloyoak, and Sanirajak to cover the major summer distribution areas for narwhal, beluga and bowhead whales. Contracts to hire observers from the respective communities will be initiated with the Regional Wildlife Office. All equipment and training needed for the survey will be provided by Fisheries and Oceans Canada.


