## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Keewatin Glacial Dynamics” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 190 kilometres (km) from Baker Lake. The Proponent aims to improve understanding of how the landscape in western Nunavut has been affected by the movement and flow of glaciers. The program is proposed to take place from July 2023 to August 2023. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of a helicopter to transport personnel and equipment to research sites daily from Tukto Lodge at Mosquito Lake in the Northwest Territories
- Use of tools to collect bedrock, boulder and soil samples
- Small fuel caches (5-7 containers each) in two (2) locations for main source of daily helicopter trips
- Waste to be brought back to the lodge for proper disposal
