PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Geological Mapping of Boundary Structures” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 60-100 kilometres (km) from Rankin Inlet. The Proponent intends to collect samples of rocks, photos, and measurements to create geological maps of the bedrock exposed across the area. The program is proposed to take place from July 5, 2023 to July 22, 2023. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of a helicopter for daily transportation of personnel to and from research sites from Rankin Inlet
- Use of research equipment to collect, record and photograph small rock samples and location data
- Use of accommodations and services within communities
