PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Sanirajak, Nunavut MET Tower” project is located within the Qikiqtani region, approximately 6 kilometres (km) from Sanirajak. The Proponent intends to construct a temporary meteorological tower to collect wind data for 18-24 months. The program is proposed to take place from Construction: August 1, 2023, to August 8, 2023. Operations: 18-24 months post-construction. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of an ATV to transport personnel and equipment to the construction site during the construction phase and to transport personnel throughout the year for maintenance;
- Use of 20 gallons of gasoline from municipal fuel services;
- Use of scheduled flights in and out of Sanirajak and use of the Hamlet of Sanirajak for accommodations and all water and sewage services; and
- Transportation of all construction materials to Sanirajak via sealift.

Parties are also invited to recommend any specific mitigation measures they feel would be appropriate, and to bring any other matter of importance related to this project proposal to the NIRB’s attention.
