Subject	Response to the Nunavut Impact Review Board’s <i>2022-2023 Annual Monitoring Report for the Back River Project</i> and the Board’s Recommendations

In December 2022 and January 2023, Sabina engaged with Kitikmeot Inuit Association, and the Government of Nunavut, in a CTAG to provide technical oversight of the Project's caribou monitoring. During the meetings Sabina provided project updates to the CTAG, held open discussions regarding key issues. Table 1 summarizes the meeting presentation topics, key issues discussed, and B2Gold commitments.
