PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Hantzsch Island Thick-Billed Murre Surveys” project is located within the Qikiqtani region, approximately 270 kilometres (km) from Iqaluit. The Proponent intends to conduct research on Thick-billed murre colonies using camera and a drone for research purposes. The project will take place in July/August in 2024 and 2025 over 1-3 days. The program is proposed to take place from July 2024 to August 8, 2025. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of boat to transport personnel and equipment to project location;
- Use of a drone to record thick-billed murres and other breeding seabirds on the island;
- Use of camera to record thick-billed murres and other breeding seabirds on the island;
- Use of 200 liters of gasoline for the boat;

Parties are also invited to recommend any specific mitigation measures they feel would be appropriate, and to bring any other matter of importance related to this project proposal to the NIRB’s attention.
