PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Access Trail to campsite” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 30 kilometres (km) from Rankin Inlet. The Proponent intends to develop an access road off the Agnico Eagle’s All-weather Access Road located 11.5 km outside of Rankin Inlet, to support an On-the-land addictions treatment program held at cabins. The program is proposed to take place from March 2023 to October 2023. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of two (2) dump trucks to deliver gravel to access site;
- Use of an excavator, front-end loader, grader, dozer, and compactor/roller to build road; and
- Use of two (2) pick-up trucks to drive employees to site
