## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Marine Habitat Use of Thick-billed Murres” project is located within the Qikiqtani region, approximately 65 kilometres (km) from Pond Inlet. The Proponent intends to amend the scope of previously approved activities to include the use of a helicopter and drones as a survey method. The program is proposed to take place from July 2024 to August 2024. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of a helicopter for surveying purposes
- Use of a drone for surveying purposes
- Refueling of the helicopter at an existing fuel cache on Bylot Island
