## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Bursting the Banks: Dealing with Flooding due to Climate Change in the Arctic” project is located within the Qikiqtani region, within the municipal boundaries of the community of Pangnirtung. The Proponent intends to conduct research to better characterize the hydrology of Pangnirtung, especially the role of the snow regime and its impact on flash flooding and drainage in the Duval River. The program is proposed to take place from April 2024 to April 2027. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of two (2) medium sized excavators
- Installation of solar panels to power weather station
- Installation and use of a weather station
- Installation of ground temperature sensors
