Although the activities are low-impact and do not involve camping, KIA encourages continued awareness of local land use, particularly in areas used by harvesters or for cultural purposes. General communication with the Hamlet of Cambridge Bay and the local HTO is encouraged to help avoid unintentional overlap with traditional land use activities.

KIA supports the inclusion of local guides and encourages opportunities to incorporate Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit (IQ) and cultural interpretation into the Cambridge Bay tour experience. Where possible, employment or capacity-building for Inuit youth or community members in tourism-related roles is encouraged.



Even in the absence of overnight camping, it is important that leave-no-trace principles be followed during all excursions. All garbage and food waste should be packed out, and participants should be briefed on how to minimize their environmental footprint.

While the summary indicates that one Cambridge Bay tour is planned for 2025, seasonal timing details are not specified. It may be helpful for planning and mitigation purposes to keep in mind local wildlife sensitivity windows, including bird nesting and calving periods, when finalizing trip dates.
