PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Kivalliq-Baffin Connector Marine Survey” project is located within the Kivalliq and Qikiqtani regions, covering communities of Iqaluit, Kimmirut, Kinngait and Salliq (Coral Harbour). The Proponent intends to conduct a marine survey along the proposed Kivalliq-Baffin Connector Fibre Optic Cable route, linking the communities of Iqaluit, Kimmirut, Kinngait and Salliq to high-speed internet. The program is proposed to take place from July 2025 to October 2026, during the open-water season for about 35 to 45 days. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- A marine survey along the proposed 1,050 kilometres (km) cable route with the survey corridor ranging between 500 metres (m) to 900 m from the centreline of the marine cable.
- Use of a 50 m marine vessel to transport up to 28 personnel to conduct the marine survey
- Use of local accommodations and facilities in Iqaluit

- a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and can be prevented/managed appropriately with known technology.

Parties are also invited to recommend any specific mitigation measures they feel would be appropriate, and to bring any other matter of importance related to this project proposal to the NIRB’s attention.
