PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Nut Lake Project” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 175 kilometres (km) southwest from Baker Lake. The Proponent intends to conduct a multi-year, phased exploration program aimed at identifying and evaluating the presence of uranium-bearing mineralization within the Nut Lake claim area. The program is proposed to take place from May 2025 to April 2029. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Prospecting, geological sampling (rock, soil and till)
- Storage of non-radioactive drill cuttings in natural depressions sumps located at each drill site; radioactive cuttings within steel drums at property and removal to an approved facility for proper disposal
- A fixed-wing aircraft and/or helicopter would be used to transport personnel, equipment, fuel and supplies to and from the project site
- A 13-person seasonal camp would be established between April and September annually
