Please describe the concerns indicated above:

I would like to express a concern for the risk of extensive devastation with uranium mining. I am aware that this is a drilling proposal, but drilling increases the advancement of mining.

The other concern I have is the lack of commitment to direct communication with the general public of Baker Lake. The following is copied and pasted from the company seeking approval:

"...Hunters and Trappers Organization, and in the event that further consultation is required, Greenridge will ensure that best efforts are made to engage with the community and organizations as advised by regulatory agencies."

It is not honest to assume KIA (Rankin Inlet) or the HTO will communicate about uranium drilling or mining with the general public in Baker Lake. I believe they should be doing that, but I think that Greenridge should assume this is not happening and communicate directly with the general public.

Do you have any suggestions or recommendations for this application?

I recommend that the Greenridge, KIA, Hamlet, and HTO be transparent and accountable to the people of Baker Lake through open public consultations.
