# Changes to the way we do monitoring and reporting

- The Project Annual Reports have become too large
- Contains information already reported to responsible authorities
- Over-detailed information for the NIRB's monitoring needs
- Excess information makes it difficult to do effective monitoring
  - Needed information may be there but is difficult to find
  - Important information may be drowned out
- Has become a general “dumping ground” for data, some of which is unneeded

## **No Lack of Reporting**

The company regularly submitted lengthy performance update reports to the Yukon government, but sheer volume doesn't mean meaningful data was easy to identify and act on

## **Resource Constraints in Agencies**

Regulatory agencies often lack technical resources, limiting their ability to thoroughly review and act on documentation (especially in smaller or more remote jurisdictions such as the North)

## **Effectiveness of Documentation**

Fewer, more meaningful documents highlighting deviations from predicted performance, the impacts and mitigation and other adaptive management measures would support better regulatory oversight and action
