The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. **Primary Land Use:** Marine-based Tourism
2. **Project summary description:** Carrying 230 passengers and 170 crew members, Hapag-Lloyd Cruises will transit North Baffin waters in Nunavut making short landings at various locations aboard Zodiacs.
3. **Summary of modifications:** Change of vessel to sister ship Hanseatic Spirit
4. **Associated NPC File Nos.:** 149152, 149153, 149817, 149819, 149973, 149975 **Associated NIRB File No.:** 08AN072
5. **Location:** Qikiqtani Region; [Port-of-Call Pond Inlet, Ice Arm Fiord, Dundas Harbour, Fram Fiord, Starnessfjord, Pim Island, Hans Island, Dundas Harbour, Croker Bay, Beechey Island, Radstock Bay, St. Helena Island, Cape Hawes, Surprise-Fjord, and Port-of-Call Grise Fiord]

The Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) has completed its review of the above noted project proposal. The NPC previously reviewed works and activities associated with the current proposal and conformity determination was most recently issued on May 26, 2023, which still applies. In addition, associated activities were previously screened by the Nunavut Impact Review Board, including zodiac landings and short excursions (NIRB File No.: 08AN072). It conforms to the North Baffin Regional Land Use Plan (NBRLUP). The proponent has undertaken to comply with the applicable conformity requirements of Appendix C, H, and I of the NBRLUP.

The above-noted project proposal is exempt from screening by the NIRB because the NPC is of the understanding that the change to an identical sister ship does not change the general scope of the original or previously amended project activities, and the exceptions noted in Section 12.4.3 (a) and (b) of the Nunavut Agreement do not apply.

By way of this letter, the NPC is forwarding the project proposal to the regulatory authorities identified by the proponent. Project materials, including the applicable conformity requirements, are available at the following address:

The regulatory authorities to which this letter is addressed are responsible under the *Nunavut Planning and Project Assessment Act (NuPPAA)* to implement any of the applicable requirements by incorporating the requirements directly, or otherwise ensuring that they must be met, in the terms and conditions of any authorizations issued.

This conformity determination applies only to the above noted project proposal as submitted. Proponents may not carry out projects and regulatory authorities may not issue licenses, permits and other authorizations in respect of projects if a review by the NPC is required. Regulatory authorities may consult with the NPC to obtain recommendations on their duties to implement the existing land use plans prior to issuing licenses, permits and other authorizations under subsection 69(6) of the *NuPPAA*.
