Dear Albert Ehaloak and Eric Sondergaard:

I appreciate the Nunavut Impact Review Board's (the Board) correspondence received on March 16, 2026, regarding the Screening Decision Report (the Report) for 6106 Resources Ltd. (the Proponent)'s Hook Lake Project (the Project). The Minister of Northern and Arctic Affairs has jurisdictional responsibility for issuing the Screening decision and I am responding on the Minister's behalf.

Following its assessment, the Board determined that the Project is not likely to cause significant public concerns, and is unlikely to result in significant adverse environmental and social impact, provided the Proponent complies with the terms and conditions set by the Board.

It has been determined that more time is needed to exercise powers and perform duties and functions in respect of the Report, pursuant to subsection 93(2) of the *Nunavut Planning and Project Assessment Act*. Therefore, I am notifying you that it is necessary to extend the decision timeline for the Project.

I would like to assure you that the Government of Canada is committed to meeting its legislated timelines. In addition, the Government of Canada understands the importance
