Thank you for this note.

Three of the four documents submitted require no further action from us. These are the letters from DFO, TC and GN.

My comments re CIRNAC concerns are as follows.

#1

The 100 litre gasoline tank refers to the the integral gas tank on our rental truck. No fuel will be transferred except at the tank farm gas station.

#2

The 12 D cell batteries are of the rechargeable type. We intent to give them to CHARS at the end of our stay in Cambridge Bay for continued use and ultimate disposal, or we might leave them in CHARS storage for use during future collecting work in Cambridge Bay.

#3

As per my meeting with the EHTO and the Directors and managers requests we intent to communicate with the residents of Cambridge Bay via Beverly Maksagak and the EHTO Facebook portal. In other words we will communicate our day to day diving plans with the EHTO for them to announce publicly when and where we will work on any given day. We also intend to work with the EHTO regarding other community engagement opportunities. The include all the ideas articulated by Richard Bingley in section #3 of his letter. We fully intend to hire the EHTO guiding for boat dives. We also hope that the EHTO provides us with guidance on purchases from Inuit owned businesses. This summers collecting effort is but the first of many to come and the start of our relation building with the community of Cambridge Bay.

Kindly let me know if my replies are channeled correctly and are meant to go through Jordan and you for your board to review during their voting session?

I hope I have adequately addressed the points raised by CIRNAC.
