Re: Notice of Screening and Comment Request for Honey Badger Silver Inc.'s "Nanisivik" project proposal

Dear Andrew Jedemann:

The Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) has commenced screening¹ the project proposal.

By copy of this letter, NIRB invites regulators, interested parties, and community members or groups potentially affected by the proposal to view the application and comment directly to the NIRB by September 25, 2026.

The NIRB would like parties to provide comments regarding:

- Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic or socio-economic effects; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse impacts on wildlife habitat or Inuit harvest activities; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (and providing any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal

Scope of proposal

Location	Qikiqtani (North Baffin) Region, approximately 20km East of the community of Arctic Bay
Objective	The Proponent intends to conduct mineral exploration activities in up to 7 mineral claims
Timeline	May 2027 to September 2032, annually from March to October

The scope of the project includes the following undertakings, work or activities:

- Use of a helicopter, pick-up trucks, and ATVs for transport of personnel, equipment and supplies;
- General exploration activities including; geological mapping, prospecting, geochemical sampling (till, soil and rock), airborne and ground geophysical surveys, stripping/trenching, and drilling (diamond and/or reverse circulation)
 - Use of heavy equipment for various exploration activities.
- Construction and use of temporary camp and fuel cache;
 - Use of a generator for temporary camp usage.
 - Storage and use of < 4,000 L of remote fuel to support exploration and drilling activities.
- Use of 299m³/day of water for temporary camp and drilling use;
- Camp greywater to be disposed of in an excavated sump and drilling greywater to be disposed of in a natural depression;
- Combustible waste may be incinerated and regularly backhauled to Arctic Bay and non-combustible waste to be removed from site and disposed of in an appropriate disposal facility; and
- Hazardous waste generated from drilling activities will be regularly backhauled to an appropriate disposal facility.

Inclusion or Exclusion of Scoping List

The NIRB has identified no additional works or activities in relation to the project proposal; as a result, the NIRB will proceed with screening the project based on the scope as described above.
