Ryan moved to Cambridge Bay from his home in Prince Edward Island in March 2007, accepting employment as a Technical Advisor with the NIRB and enthusiastically applying his background and knowledge as a Biologist to his new role. He quickly adapted to his new home and position, immersing himself in the community and his work while traveling throughout Nunavut in support of the Board's assessments. In 2009 Ryan was promoted to Director of Technical Services and again in 2011 was promoted to Executive Director, assuming the lead role for the staff and operations of the NIRB.

Throughout his employment with the NIRB, Ryan has been a leader and mentor within the organization as well as with many of the Board's external partners, always bringing humour and exceptional professionalism to his work. Following the Board's recent announcement of the appointment of Karen Costello as incoming Executive Director (effective June 1), Ryan noted: "It's been my pleasure to serve as the NIRB's Executive Director for the past 8+ years and I look forward to a smooth transition with Karen through the coming weeks."

Ryan and his partner Matilde will be relocating to Prince Edward Island as they prepare to welcome their first child later this summer. His last day on active duty with the NIRB will be May 1, 2020.
