MESSAGE FROM THE ACTING CHAIRPERSON

I am pleased to present the Nunavut Impact Review Board's Annual Report for the 2011-2012 fiscal year (April 1, 2011 – March 31, 2012). The NIRB's mission is to protect and promote the well-being of the Environment and Nunavummiut through the impact assessment process established by the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement (NLCA). There has been a marked increase in proposed development in Nunavut, resulting in another busy and successful year for the NIRB. I am proud of the work that my fellow Board members and our staff have completed, and we are preparing for another busy year ahead!

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2011-2012

During 2011-2012 the NIRB staff and Board were kept busy with a total of **204** project proposals that were submitted for assessment in accordance with Article 12 of the NLCA. In addition to **66** new proposals requiring Screening, there were **7** projects undergoing Review and **3** projects with active monitoring programs.

The Board and staff continued to implement the NIRB's 5 Year Strategic Plan (2008-2013), with a focus, where funding allows, on key areas such as governance, legislation, policy development, and human resources. In order to ensure its continued success, the Board also updated its internal operational and board governance policies, and hired several new staff members to assist with fulfilling the NIRB's mandate.

The Board and staff have also completed additional initiatives and training related to Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit, uranium mining, marine issues and board governance practices. The Board and staff have attended, presented, and participated in a number of conferences and workshops throughout the year, encouraging continued advancement of environmental assessment practices and standards and explaining the workings of NIRB's processes to industry proponents. The Board continues to collaborate with its partners in government and with Inuit organizations to ensure the most efficient regulatory system possible. To this end the NIRB is currently in talks with the National Energy Board regarding developing a Memorandum Of Understanding between our respective organizations.

THE FUTURE

In 2012 and 2013, key initiatives for the Board will include developing the next five year strategic plan for the organization, advancing our integration of Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit into the NIRB's processes and procedures, continuing the public awareness programs for ongoing reviews, working on marine issues through the Nunavut Marine Council, assisting with the finalization of enabling legislation, and continuing the revisions to our series of public guides.

INTRODUCTION: OUR MANDATE, MISSION, AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) was established on July 9, 1996 as an Institution of Public Government with responsibilities for the environmental assessment of project proposals in the Nunavut Settlement Area as described in Article 12 of the NLCA. The primary functions of the Board pursuant to the NLCA are to screen project proposals in order to determine whether or not a review is required; to gauge and define the extent of the regional impact of a project; to review the ecosystemic and socio-economic impacts of proposals; to determine whether proposals should proceed, and if so, under what terms and conditions; and to monitor projects as they proceed.

The mandate of the NIRB shall be to use both traditional knowledge and recognized scientific methods in ecosystemic and socio-economic analyses to assess and monitor, on a site-specific and regional basis, the environmental, cultural and socio-economic impacts of the project proposals for which it has responsibility.

The mission of the NIRB shall be to protect and promote the well-being of the environment and Nunavummiut through the impact assessment process.





Henry got involved in politics in 1974 when he served as the Chairman of the Settlement Council and later as Deputy Mayor. He also sat on the board of the NWT Housing Corporation for two terms in the 1980's along with many other Boards and agencies. Henry's first language is Inuinnaqtun and his second language is English.

SCREENING PROCESS

The NIRB conducts environmental screenings of project proposals in accordance with Section 12.4.1 of the NLCA which states:

"Upon receipt of a proposal, NIRB shall screen the proposal to determine whether it has significant impact potential, and therefore whether it requires review under Part 5 or 6."

Pursuant to Section 12.4.4 of the NLCA, the Board may make one of four determinations following screening:

- a. The proposal may be processed without a review under Part 5 or 6; NIRB may recommend specific terms and conditions to be attached to any approval, reflecting the primary objectives set out in Section 12.2.5;
 - b. The proposal requires review under Part 5 or 6; NIRB shall identify particular issues or concerns which should be considered in such a review;
 - c. The proposal is insufficiently developed to permit proper screening, and should be returned to the proponent for clarification; or
 - d. The potential adverse impacts of the proposal are so unacceptable that it should be modified or abandoned.



From April 1, 2011 to March 31, 2012 the NIRB received a total of 204 project proposals pursuant to Part 4, Article 12 of the NLCA. Of these, 66 proposals were for new projects or significant modifications to existing projects which required Screening:

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BATHURST INLET PORT AND ROAD JOINT VENTURE LTD's BIPR PROJECT (NIRB: 03UN114)

The Bathurst Inlet Port and Road (BIPR) project consists of a proposed port and facilities on Bathurst Inlet, a 211 km all-weather road to Contwoyto Lake (which would connect to the existing Tibbit to Contwoyto winter road), and a 20 person camp at Contwoyto Lake. The project proponent is Bathurst Inlet Port and Road Joint Venture Ltd., a partnership between Kitikmeot Corporation (50%) and Nuna Logistics Ltd. (50%). Originally recommended for Review in 2003, a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the BIPR project was submitted to the Board by the proponent in early 2008. The Review of the BIPR project was subsequently suspended following an August 1, 2008 request from BIPR Joint Venture Ltd. to suspend further technical review until the schedule of the project and its potential users could be reassessed in early 2009.

On June 26, 2009 the NIRB received communication from the BIPR Joint Venture Ltd. requesting further suspension of the Part 5 Review process until "owners of the affected projects can thoroughly evaluate their respective properties". On July 7, 2011 BIPR wrote to the Board stating that they did not intend to re-engage the technical review process and on August 26, 2011 the NIRB wrote to the Minister of Aboriginal

However, on December 1, 2011 the NIRB received communications from Sabina Gold & Silver Corp. (Sabina) that they had completed the purchase of the BIPR project from the BIPR Joint Venture Ltd. and were requesting that they have time to assess potential development options prior to the termination of the Board's Review. Sabina subsequently indicated that they intend to re-engage the Review process and to submit an updated Draft EIS toward the end of 2012.

MINERALS AND METALS GROUP'S HIGH LAKE PROJECT (NIRB: 06MN082)

The High Lake project is a proposed copper, zinc, gold and silver mine located in the Kitikmeot region. The project is currently owned by Minerals and Metals Group (MMG), which was formed in June 2009 with the purchase of most of OZ Minerals Ltd.'s assets, including the High Lake property, by China Minmetals. Mining methods proposed for this development include the use of both open pit and underground mining. The mine site and processing facility would be at High Lake, which is located approximately 175 km southeast of Kugluktuk. It would be serviced by a 49 km winter road during the construction period, and a 53 km all season road during the operation period.

The High Lake project was originally referred to the NIRB for review by the Minister of INAC in 2007. NIRB staff conducted community meetings in the 7 communities in the Kitikmeot region in July 2007. The project proposal was accepted as a Draft EIS by the Board in August 2007 and has undergone an initial round of technical review, with Technical Meetings held by the NIRB in late November/early December 2007. In May 2008, the NIRB formally postponed the review until such time as the proponent is ready to re-engage the process. In March 2011, MMG requested a one year extension to the suspension of the NIRB's review of the High Lake project proposal. In December 2011, MMG indicated that it did not intend to re-engage the NIRB's Review of the High Lake project. On this basis, in February 2012, the NIRB recommended to the Minister of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development to consider terminating the review of the High Lake project.

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URAVAN MINERALS INC's GARRY LAKE PROJECT (NIRB: 08EN037)

The Garry Lake project consists of a uranium exploration program in the Kivalliq region, approximately 235 km northwest of Baker Lake, as proposed by Uravan Minerals Inc. After screening the project proposal, the NIRB determined that the nature, timing, and location of the project indicated that it: (i) has the potential to cause significant adverse ecosystemic effects, (ii) may have significant adverse socio-economic effects on northerners, and (iii) has caused significant public concern.

On September 25, 2008 the Minister referred the Garry Lake project to the NIRB for a review of the ecosystemic and socio-economic impacts under Part 5 of Article 12 of the NLCA. Pursuant to Section 12.5.4 of the NLCA, the Minister asked that "the Board structure the review in a manner that will facilitate a thorough, yet expeditious review of the project". Additionally, the Minister stated his support for focusing the scope of the Review on the project's impacts and cumulative impacts on wildlife habitat and Inuit wildlife harvesting.

Following a public scoping and guideline development workshop in Baker Lake in November of 2008, the Board issued final guidelines for the

February 20, 2009. These guidelines were the result of significant input from the public and will form the basis of the Board's technical review of the project. As of March 31, 2012 the Board continues to await a draft EIS submission from the proponent for this project.

SABINA GOLD & SILVER CORP.'s HACKETT RIVER PROJECT (NIRB: 08MN006)

The Hackett River project, as proposed by Sabina Gold & Silver Corp. (Sabina), involves the construction and operation of a combined surface and underground base metal mine located on both Inuit Owned lands and Crown lands. Three significant deposits, East Cleaver, Main Zone, and Boot Lake, have been identified on the property, with total indicated resources (zinc, silver, copper, lead, and gold) of approximately 47 million tonnes. The operational life of the project is anticipated to be approximately 14 years, with the mine expected to employ approximately 250 -325 personnel on rotating shifts during that time.

This project has been undergoing a Review by the NIRB since September 2008, when the Board received a referral from the Minister of INAC in accordance with Section 12.4.7 of the NLCA. Following several rounds of public commenting, community scoping meetings and a guidelines development workshop, the Board

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issued guidelines to the proponent for the creation of an EIS in April 2009. Correspondence from Sabina in 2010 indicated that they would not be submitting the document during the 2011-2012 fiscal year as they were conducting preliminary feasibility assessments and collecting baseline environmental data. During the 2011-2012 fiscal year, the NIRB received indication that the project ownership had changed, and on February 8, 2012 the NIRB requested that the new Proponent, Xstrata Zinc Canada, provide the NIRB with an official update on the project ownership as well as projected times of any future submissions. On March 16, 2012 they responded that they will continue work, including a pre-feasibility assessment, and they intend to submit a Draft EIS in the second quarter of 2013.

BAFFINLAND IRON MINES CORP's MARY RIVER PROJECT (NIRB: 08MN053)

The Mary River project, proposed by Baffinland Iron Mines Corporation (BIMC), is located on Baffin Island. The project involves the construction, operation, closure, and reclamation of an 18 million tonne-per-annum (Mt/a) open pit iron mine. High-grade iron ore would be mined and processed at the Mary River mine site and transported to an all-season deep seaport at Steensby Inlet via a 143 km railway system. From the port site, the ore products would be shipped to overseas markets by ore carriers through Foxe Basin and Hudson Strait. Year-round shipping would be

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undertaken with a dedicated fleet of cape-sized ore carriers with the capacity to break ice, while additional non-icebreaking ore carriers and conventional ships would be used during the open water season.

In February, 2009 the Minister of INAC referred this project to the NIRB for a Review pursuant to Part 5 of Article 12 of the NLCA. During the 2011-12 reporting period the NIRB coordinated the public review of a Draft EIS submission including the scheduling of public information sessions in 11 Nunavut communities, and scheduling of additional technical meetings and pre-hearing conferences in Igloolik and Pond Inlet. The NIRB issued a Pre-Hearing Conference Decision to Baffinland on December 9, 2012, outlining directions for the Final Environmental Impact Statement (Final EIS), logistical arrangements, the timeline for the Final Hearing, and other matters that would aid in the simplification of the Final Hearing.

The NIRB received a Final EIS submission from Baffinland in February, 2012 and after an internal conformity review, accepted the submission and commenced the final phase of the Board's Review. The NIRB anticipates scheduling of a Final Hearing for this file in the coming months.

AREVA RESOURCES CANADA INC.'s KIGGAVIK PROJECT (NIRB: 09MN003)

The Kiggavik project is a proposed uranium ore mining and milling operation located

in the Kivalliq Region, approximately 80 km west of Baker Lake. The project is proposed by AREVA Resources Canada Inc., and would include the development of five individual mines; three open pit mines at the Kiggavik site, and both an open pit mine and an underground mine at the Sissons site. A dock and storage facility is proposed for Baker Lake which would serve as a transfer and storage facility for materials and supplies en route to the Kiggavik site. Reagents, fuel and supplies would be barged to the proposed storage facility near Baker Lake and transported to the Kiggavik site via truck on a 90-100 km access road. Uranium ore concentrate, commonly referred to as yellowcake, would be transported by air to southern Canada. The mine construction, operation and decommissioning phases would last about 25 years.

On March 2, 2010 the Minister of INAC referred the Kiggavik project to the NIRB for a review of its potential ecosystemic and socio-economic impacts pursuant to Part 5 of Article 12 of the NLCA. Following a series of public scoping meetings in identified impacted communities in the Kivalliq region and a guidelines development workshop in Baker Lake, the NIRB issued Guidelines for the development of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to the Proponent in May 2011. In December 2011, the

MONITORING PROCESS

 - b. To determine whether and to what extent the land or resource use in question is carried out within the predetermined terms and conditions;
 - c. To provide the information base necessary for agencies to enforce terms and conditions of land or resource use approvals; and
 - d. To assess the accuracy of the predictions contained in the project impact statements.

JERICHO DIAMOND MINE (NIRB: 00MN059)

In July 2004, the NIRB issued Project Certificate No. 002 for the Jericho Diamond Mine project to Tahera Diamond Corporation (Tahera). The Jericho project is situated in the West Kitikmeot region about 430 kilometer (km) southwest of Cambridge Bay and 240 km southeast of Kugluktuk. Tahera commenced construction of the mine in March 2005, and maintained full mining operations between July 2006 and January 2008, at which time Tahera filed for creditor protection citing insufficient funds to operate the Jericho Diamond Mine and the site was placed under Care and Maintenance. In December 2009, Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) intervened pursuant to Section 89 of the Nunavut Waters and Nunavut Surface Rights Tribunal Act, and assumed control of the Care and Maintenance of the Jericho Mine site. By August 2010, the purchase by Shear Minerals Ltd. (renamed to Shear Diamonds (Nunavut) Corp.) of Tahera's assets including the Jericho Diamond Mine was approved. On December 21, 2011 Shear Diamonds was issued the renewal water licence from the Nunavut Water Board for the Jericho Diamond Mine which currently remains under Care and Maintenance as the new owners evaluate the mineral resources.

The NIRB is responsible for the monitoring of this Project in accordance with Part 7, Article 12 of the NLCA. As part of the Board's monitoring responsibilities for this project, the NIRB's Monitoring Officer visits the site, reviews reports submitted by the proponent, and prepares a

In September 2006, the NIRB issued a Project Certificate (PC No. 003) to Miramar Hope Bay Ltd for the Doris North Gold Mine project. The Project is located 110 kilometres (km) south of Cambridge Bay, in the West Kitikmeot region of Nunavut on the Canadian mainland. The site is accessed by sealift for fuel, equipment and supplies and by air for some freight and personnel travelling in and out. The major components proposed for the Doris North project included a campsite, underground mine and associated mill plant and tailings containment facilities at the mine site, a jetty, a fuel tank farm and laydown area at the Roberts Bay area linking to the Doris North mine site by a 5 km all-weather road.

In early 2008, Newmont Mining Corporation successfully purchased all interests of Miramar and its subsidiary properties in the Hope Bay belt, including the Doris North holding. Following the acquisition, a new business entity, Hope Bay Mining Ltd. (HBML) was established to operate the Doris North Project and other subsidiary properties in the Hope Bay belt. Following a revaluation of the original development plan, in September 2008 HBML decided to defer the Doris North underground gold mine development plan in order to pursue a broader belt-wide development strategy. In January 2010, HBML defined a more detailed staged development strategy and implementation plan for the Doris North

During the construction of the Doris North Project, the Nunavut Water Board (NWB) amended HBML's Doris North Project Type A Water Licence in 2010 and 2011 on HBML's requests and following the NIRB's approvals, allowing HBML to change some of the project components as a result of engineering refinement. On November 14, 2011 HBML submitted an application package to the NIRB and the NWB requesting amendments to both the NIRB Project Certificate and NWB Type A Water Licence. On December 8, 2011 HBML submitted its "Phase 2 Hope Bay Belt" project proposal to the NIRB for screening. On January 31, 2012 HBML advised the NIRB that its parent company, Newmont Mining Corporation had placed the development of the Doris North Project and exploration of the Hope Bay belt into a care and maintenance phase. While it noted that on-site activities would currently be limited to care and maintenance as a result of the decision, HBML indicated that the NIRB continue to process two applications, namely the amendment application to NIRB Project Certificate No. 003 and the "Phase 2 Hope Bay Belt Project".

On February 24, 2012, the NIRB made a NLCA 12.4.4(b) decision to the AANDC Minister recommending that HBML's "Phase 2 Hope Bay Belt Project" for a full Review, while HBML's amendment application associated with the Doris North Project was still being proceeded. On March 1,

2012 HBML requested that the NIRB and NWB suspend processing of the amendment application while it was developing a detailed plan to ensure all regulatory obligations are fulfilled during the care and maintenance period.

MEADOWBANK GOLD MINE (NIRB: 03MN107)

The NIRB issued Project Certificate No. 004 to Cumberland Resources for the Meadowbank Gold Mine project in December of 2006 following an extensive Part 5 NLCA Review of the proposed project. In early 2007, Agnico-Eagle Mines Ltd (AEM) acquired Cumberland Resources Ltd.'s assets, including the Meadowbank Gold Mine project and began construction of the mine facilities. The Meadowbank mine officially moved into the operations phase in 2010, with the first gold bar being poured on February 27, 2010.

The Meadowbank project consists of an open pit gold mine located north of the hamlet of Baker Lake as well as associated infrastructure such as a fuel tank farm and laydown area within the hamlet and a 110 kilometre all weather access road from the hamlet to the Meadowbank site. The Meadowbank Gold Mine is currently Nunavut's only operating mine.

As part of the Board's ongoing monitoring responsibilities for this project, the NIRB's Monitoring Officer followed up on the recommendations made by the Board during the 2010 reporting period, visited the Meadowbank site in September of 2011, reviewed reports submitted by AEM and prepared a summary report outlining AEM's compliance with the terms and

As the Meadowbank project continues operations, the NIRB is prepared for its monitoring efforts to become increasingly involved as it aims to prevent or mitigate the potential impacts predicted during the environmental assessment of the project.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

The NIRB operates under the principle that public participation is an important element of an open and balanced environmental assessment process. Effective public participation strengthens the quality of the NIRB's Review process and helps to avoid potential misunderstandings and conflict. The NIRB has an obligation to create opportunities for the active and informed participation of the public at every possible stage of the Review process.

Highlights of the Board's extensive public participation programs included: technical meetings, public information meetings, and Pre-Hearing Conference meetings for Baffinland's Mary River project proposal; and Public Scoping meetings for AEM's Meliadine Gold Mine project proposal. During 2011-2012 the NIRB processed a total of 204 project proposals that were submitted for environmental impact assessment in accordance with Article 12 of the NLCA. In addition to new proposals requiring Screening, the following projects were subject to Review under NLCA Article 12, Part 5:

- Sabina Gold and Silver Corp.'s Bathurst Inlet Port and Road (BIPR) development proposal
 - MMG Resources Inc.'s High Lake mine development proposal
 - Sabina Gold and Silver Corp.'s Hackett River mine development proposal
 - Uravan Mineral Inc.'s Garry Lake mineral exploration proposal

For a number of these ongoing assessments the NIRB has been working closely with the NWB to develop a more coordinated impact assessment and water licensing process. The Boards have released a public guide for proponents who wish to pursue a more coordinated approach and potentially reduce overall licensing timelines.

During 2011-2012, the NIRB also employed full time monitoring officers to continue monitoring programs for the Jericho Diamond Mine, the Doris North Gold Mine, and the Meadowbank Gold Mine projects. Unlike most Northern EA Boards, the NIRB has a mandate for Screening, Review and Monitoring; as additional major developments are approved to proceed and begin operating within the Nunavut Settlement Area, the effort associated with fulfilling the NIRB's Monitoring mandate will continue to increase significantly.

The following outlines the highlights from the past year.

NIRB–NUNAVUT WATER BOARD

Related to the fulfillment of Section 13.6.1 of the NLCA, the NIRB continues to work with the NWB to promote coordination of the impact assessment/water licensing processes during the screening phase of the regulatory system. Following consultation with the public, the NIRB and the NWB developed a Detailed Coordinated Process Framework document which guides the coordination of water licensing within the framework of NIRB reviews for major development, pursuant to NLCA Section 13.5.2. This coordinated approach is currently being tested with the ongoing assessment of Baffinland Iron Mines Corp.'s Mary River project, and is expected to significantly reduce the overall licensing time should the project be approved to proceed.

NIRB–NUNAVUT MARINE COUNCIL

Pursuant to NLCA, Section 15.4.1:

The NIRB, the NWB, the NPC, and the NWMB may jointly, as a Nunavut Marine Council, or severally advise and make recommendations to other government agencies regarding the marine areas, and Government shall consider such advice and recommendations in making decisions which affect marine areas.

Following discussions initiated in 2008, the NIRB has continued to promote the potential usefulness of collaboration amongst the Institutions of Public Government (IPG) through the NMC. The NIRB feels that the NMC would be well poised to offer advice and recommendations to government on issues common to each IPG's mandate that affect the marine environment of the Nunavut Settlement Area. In February 2012, the IPGs publicly released a business case for the NMC and are currently seeking funding opportunities to move forward with this important initiative. In conducting its analysis, and in formulating and providing its advice and recommendations, the Council plans to concentrate on:

- Promoting public awareness of issues that affect or may affect marine areas;
 - Consulting with Nunavummiut concerning those marine issues of most concern to them;
 - Monitoring *Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit*, science, literature, government, media and industry reports regarding changes, developments and concerns relevant to the marine areas; and
 - Reviewing existing or proposed regulatory, policy, research, development and management planning initiatives that affect, or may in the future affect, the marine areas - and advocating the need for improvements, as required.

As a crucial initial step, the NMC is planning to organize and host a “*Symposium on Arctic Marine Issues*” in 2012-2013, to inform the public about - and focus attention on - marine issues of particular significance to Nunavut, and to assist the Council to identify and prioritize those marine issues

NIRB—LEGISLATIVE WORKING GROUP

The NIRB remains committed to working closely with the Federal and Territorial governments, and NTI in order to assist with the finalization of (the former) Bill C-25, the Nunavut Planning and Project Assessment Act (NUPPAA). When complete, this new piece of legislation will further define both the regulatory framework for the Nunavut Planning Commission's (NPC's) land use planning process and the NIRB's development impact assessment process, as established by the NLCA. As of March 31, 2011 Bill C-25 had died on the table when the parliament was prorogued, however it is likely that the most current draft of NUPPAA may be re-introduced into the House of Commons by the Minister of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development in the coming year.

NIRB-NUNAVIK MARINE REGION BOARDS

The NIRB was pleased to provide training to the board members and staff of the newly-formed Nunavik Marine Region Planning Commission and Nunavik Marine Region Impact Review Board in 2011. The Nunavik Boards have author-

Additional Coordination

The NIRB undertakes significant efforts to ensure it maintains effective working relationships with various parties across Nunavut's regulatory system. During the 2011-2012 fiscal year the Board held coordination meetings with the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission in the assessment of the proposed Kiggavik Uranium Mine; with the National Energy Board regarding its Arctic Off-shore Drilling Review; with the NPC in its development of a Nunavut-wide land use plan; with the staff of the Minister of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development; as well as with numerous other stakeholders and industry proponents.



Major development proposals which are undergoing Screening or which may be submitted to the NIRB for assessment in the upcoming fiscal year include: Hope Bay Mining Ltd.'s Phase II Gold Mine Project, Advanced Explorations' Roche Bay Iron Ore Mine Project, Sabina Gold and Silver's Back River Gold Mine Project, Min Metals Group's Izok Corridor Mine Project and Qulliq Energy Corp.'s Jayne's Inlet Hydro Project.

In addition to project-specific assessments, each year the NIRB participates in and undertakes numerous initiatives designed to improve Nunavut's regulatory system. NUPPAA is expected to be re-introduced into the House of Commons in 2012 and, if passed, will lead to increased certainty in the regulatory process and clarified direction for the NPC and the NIRB. The NIRB looks forward to continued participation in the legislative process and preparing to implement this new direction, once passed.

The NIRB is currently revising its series of public guides in an effort to make them more accessible to the general public, with a targeted release date of April 1, 2013. Other ongoing initiatives such as a re-launch of the NIRB website with improved functionality, continued development of an in-house learning library, the creation of a summer internship program, and the

Summary Notes to Financial Statements

March 31, 2012

1. Organization and Jurisdiction

The Nunavut Impact Review Board (the "Board") is established under the *Nunavut Land Claims Agreement* with a mandate to use both traditional Inuit knowledge and recognized scientific methods in an ecosystem analysis to assess and monitor on a site-specific and regional basis the environmental, cultural and socio-economic impact of development proposals. The Board is exempt from tax under paragraph 149(1)(l) of the *Income Tax Act*.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies used by management in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Financial Instruments — recognition and measurement

Section 3855 requires that all financial assets and financial liabilities be measured at fair value on initial recognition except for certain related party transactions. Measurement in subsequent periods depends on whether the financial asset or liability has been classified as held-for-trading, available-for-sale, held-to-maturity, loans and receivables or other liabilities.

Financial instruments classified as held-for-trading are subsequently measured at fair value and unrealized gains and losses are included in net income in the period in which they arise. The Board has classified cash as held-for-trading.

Available-for-sale assets are those non-derivative financial assets that are designated as available-for-sale or are not classified as held-for-trading, held-to-maturity, or loans and receivables. Available-for-sale assets are subsequently measured at fair value, when possible, with unrealized gains and losses recorded in other comprehensive income until realized, at which time they will be recognized in net income. The Board does not have any financial instruments classified as available-for-sale.

Held-to-maturity assets are those non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments and fixed maturity that the Board has an intention and ability to hold until maturity, excluding those assets that have been classified as held-for-trading, available-for-sale, or loans and receivables. The Board does not have any financial instruments classified as held-to-maturity.

Financial instruments classified as loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets resulting from the delivery of cash or other assets by a lender to a borrower in return for a promise to repay on a specified date or dates, or on demand, usually with interest. These assets do not include debt securities or assets classified as held-for-trading. The Board classifies accounts receivable as loans and receivables.

Accounts payable and accrued liabilities, due to Indian Affairs and Northern Development, and wages and benefits payable are classified as other financial instruments and are measured at cost or amortized cost.

2. Accounting Policies (continued)

(b) Fund accounting

The Board uses fund accounting to segregate between its Operating Fund and Investment in Equipment. The Operating Fund reports the revenue and expenses relating to the general operations.

Investment in Equipment reports the assets and liabilities related to the Board's investment in equipment and the amortization of equipment.

(c) Accrued leave and termination benefits

Employees' vacation pay and banked overtime are accrued as earned.

(d) Recognition of contributions

The Board follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Revenue received in advance of being used for the delivery of goods and services is deferred and recognized as revenue when used. Revenue received in excess of related expenses must be repaid to the funder in most cases and is set up as repayable for the corresponding year.

(e) Equipment

Equipment are recorded at cost in Investment in Equipment. Amortization is calculated by the declining balance method except for leasehold improvements which are calculated by the straight line method over the term of the lease, at the annual rates set out in note 6.

(f) Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the updated amounts of revenues and expenses during the period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

2. Accounting Policies (continued)

(g) Allocation of expenses

The Board allocates expenditures according to the contribution agreement to which the expenditure relates. The expenditures are any direct cost related to the fulfillment of the contribution agreement. The costs are then allocated to the contribution agreement based on the actual amount of the expenditure.

Wages and benefits are allocated to contribution agreements based on the time spent working on the fulfillment of the agreement. The percentage of wages and benefits that are allocated to each project range from 25% to 75%.

3. Future Accounting Changes

Public Sector Accounting Standards

In October 2010 the Public Sector Accounting Board ("PSAB") decided that, effective for fiscal years beginning on or after January 1, 2012, government not-for-profit organizations ("GNPO's") that have been preparing their financial statements in accordance with accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations contained in Section 4400 of the CICA Handbook, must report in accordance with the CICA's Public Sector Accounting Handbook into which Section 4400 will be incorporated. Early adoption of either framework is permitted, however, the Board has decided against early adoption. The impact of the transition to these accounting standards has not been determined.

4. Cash

The Board has a revolving demand loan for general business purposes. Any outstanding balance bears interest at the prime rate. No amount was outstanding at year end. There is a general security agreement covering all assets other than real property in place.

9. Economic Dependence

The Board is dependent upon funding in the form of contributions from the Government of Canada - Indian and Northern Affairs. Management is of the opinion that if the funding was reduced or altered, operations would be significantly affected.

10. Commitments

The Board has entered into a 5 year lease agreement, with a 5 year renewal period, for business premises commencing on April 1, 2009 and ending on March 31, 2019. Annual lease commitments for the years ended 2012 - 2014 are \$203,344. Annual lease commitments for the years ended 2015 - 2019 are \$223,573.

The Board has entered into lease agreements for office equipment that expire as late as July 2017. Aggregate annual lease commitments to lease expiry dates are as follows: 2012 to 2014 - \$19,340; 2015 - \$1,902; 2016 - \$1,524; 2017 - \$762.

11. Financial Instruments

The following sections describe the Board's financial risk management objectives and policies and the Board's financial risk exposures.

Financial risk management objectives and policies

The Board currently does not have any risk management objectives and policies in place.

Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will fail to discharge an obligation and cause the other party to incur a financial loss. The Board is exposed to credit risk from its funders.

12. Budget

The budget figures presented are unaudited, and are those approved by the Board.

13. Interfund Transfer

The amount of \$34,835 (2011 □ \$53,357) consists of the transfers from the Operating Fund to Investment in Equipment to fund the acquisition of assets.

14. Pension Contributions

The Board and its employees make contributions to employee RPPs. These contributions represent the total liability of the Board and are recognized in the accounts on a current basis. Total contributions for 2012 were \$105,675 (2011 □ \$111,117).

15. Comparative Figures

Certain of the prior year figures have been reclassified to conform with the current year's presentation.

16. Capital Disclosures

The Board's objectives when managing capital are:

(a) To safeguard the Board's ability to continue as a going concern, so that it can continue to provide services for the territory of Nunavut.

The Board manages the capital structure in light of changes in economic conditions and the risk characteristic of the underlying assets. The Board monitors capital on the basis of net working capital which is calculated as current assets minus current liabilities as follows:
